## Full or Half day trips from Ironwood

### DO THE DOWNTOWN



Spend the entire day discovering Ironwood. Take Business 2 to the downtown district. Make sure you keep heading South to see Hiawatha, the big Indian. Stop in and shop some unique stores. Visit the Ironwood Historical Society and the Ironwood Area Chamber in the Old Depot Train Museum. Take a break and look at all the blooming flowers in the Pocket Park. Walk up the street and see the Carnegie Library, built in 1901, for Michigan history books, genealogy, and class year-books. You can grab a quick lunch at one of the great diners downtown. Next, stop at the Memorial Building (open to the public and serves as the City Office). Make sure you look at the beautiful stained glass windows, the statue of the Doughboy and the museum next to the Women's Club room. The day is nearing an end, go to the Gogebic Community College Arboretum for a walk or up to Mt. Zion's overlook for a beautiful sunset. On a clear day you can see Copper Peak. Check the performance schedule for the Ironwood Theatre or Theatre North for some fun.



### TIME FOR A PICNIC!



Enjoy an afternoon in Ironwood Township. Head North on Lake Road for a scenic, 25 mile, country drive. Spirit Lake (aka Lost Lake) is a non-motorized lake that is a perfect place for a picnic. This park

is handicap accessible with a pavilion, swimming area, and restrooms. Continue driving and you will see a natural spring with nice cold water. Just before the spring, turn on to Powers Road (a well maintained 9 mile gravel road through county forest) to a beautiful panoramic view of Lake Superior. Hike up Bald Mountain for another vista. Head back to Lake Road and stop at Little Girl's Point for a camping spot or a place to search for agates. Next stop, Superior Falls for a beautiful view of a waterfall. Then head down to Saxon Harbor and visit the Harbor Lights for some homemade pizza or just a quick refreshing drink. See the new harbor and check out the boating club. Continue into Wisconsin for more exciting adventures.
